Descriptif	This course aims to collectively explore and examine internationalism as a key strategy for Black, African, and Indigenous activist women in 20th and 21st centuries. The case studies presented in class illustrate the multiple ways by which key activists seize the international arena to amplify their voices; to inform, exchange, and network with other members of civil society; as well as to organize and pressure governements. Given their structural disenfranchisement in terms of race, gender, class, sexuality and/or religion, we will question what means and possibilities are at reach for 'unexpected members of civil society' in an international arena that was not shaped in their favor and continues to be marked by power relations and domination.
