Descriptif	<p>The main purpose of this course is to make students familiar with the concepts and methods of comparative public law, in order to give them some tools to analyze existing juridical systems and also to challenge existing definitions and classifications. Comparing different approaches to separation of powers, federalism, judicial review and rights, the course also aims to give an understanding on how different constitutional orders have addressed some common issues in public law and contemporary democracies and how they could face contemporary challenges.</p> <p>Organization of the course</p> <p>This course will be divided in two parts. The first part will take the form of a traditional lecture. Nonetheless active participation is highly recommended, since some time will be left to discussion during classes. The second part will be dedicated to the discussion of a selection of scholar papers. In this second part, at least one reading is mandatory.</p>
