The class has a twofold purpose. It aims, first of all, to provide an overview of the main problems facing the international economy, by examining them from a historical perspective and highlighting the role of institutions. Secondly, it will present the basic concepts and principles of economic analysis, describe the mechanisms at work in the world economy, and will explain the sequences and interactions between real economic phenomena, monetary phenomena, and political interventions.

The class is divided into two sections. The first will focus on international monetary and financial problems. The second section will address issues related to international trade and the multilateral trading system.
