



## French political institutions

### Presentation

The course is divided into two stages. The first stage will consist of studying French constitutional history, to be able to historically situate the Constitution of the Fifth Republic within the political “tradition” of France since the Revolution. The second part of the course will then consist in examining the constitutional organs of the State and their relations as organised by the Constitution of 4 October 1958.

### Recommended Prerequisite(s)

No prerequisites for this course, but students must have basic knowledge of the functioning of political systems, as would be expected of any citizen. As the course is to be attended by foreign students (students in a dual program or completing their compulsory year abroad), sufficient proficiency in written and oral French is required.
