



## Housing policies

### Presentation

The objective of this seminar is to provide students with knowledge about public policies in the field of housing. For this purpose, the class is organized around the analysis of 6 controversies, i.e. issues of discussion related to the conduct of public action in the field of housing. The seminar also aims to develop the students' awareness of the historical evolution of reference systems and action mechanisms in housing policies. We will use intentionally diverse territorial examples (from tense market to relaxed market situations).

### Recommended Prerequisite(s)

No pre-requisites are required, but a general knowledge of urban policy and, possibly, national housing policy can be useful in helping students understand and actively participate in this seminar.
